GARDEN CITY GAB arden City has a Police Department!

In 2015, Weld County Commissioners informed the Garden City Board of Trustees that the County would not be providing law enforcement services after 2018. The Board of Trustees researched many options, including contracting with neighboring Police Departments. The Board decided the best solution would be to create the Garden City Police Department. The Town's own Police Department will be more responsive to

the Town's needs with 24/7 coverage.

The Town is honored to have Chief Jeremy Black leading the force in Garden City. Chief Black was assigned to Garden City with the Sheriff's Office in the past. He is looking forward to renewing relationships with local businesses and citizens.

The Department is scheduled to begin operations on January 1, 2018.

This is a free service to residents and businesses in Garden City.

Items that are **not allowed** in the dumpsters include toxic chemicals, paint, oil, appliances containing freon (refrigerators, freezers, air conditioners, etc), and batteries. 8th Avenue Realignment

Engineering is complete on the 8th Avenue Realighment project. Construction will be starting in the spring. 
There will be the typical inconveniences associated with road construction, but the results will be worth it.
