

8TH AVENUE REALIGNMENT PROJECT

Garden City is moving forward with plans to improve the 8th Avenue corridor with sidewalks, crosswalks, landscaping, pedestrian lighting and safer parking options.

Baseline Engineering has been contracted to provide the engineering construction plans on the 8th Avenue Realignment Project. Meetings with businesses and residents are being scheduled so the engineering firm can consider everyone's needs and desires. Great news! The Board of Trustees extended the Landscape Voucher Program for 2017. Vouchers for Happy Life Gardens in Evans are now available at the Town Hall. You must fill out an application and also apply for the Water Rebate Program. Both applications are available on our website, townofgardencity.com, or at the Town Hall.

What you get:


- Landscape voucher: \$100



GARDEN CITY POLICE DEPARTMENT


The Town of Garden City is in the process of buying the property at 2719 7th Avenue, formerly Jerry's Furniture Upholstery, for the future Garden City Police Department.

Weld County made the decision in 2016 to phase out the provision of law enforcement services to towns in Weld County by 2018. This left the Board of Trustees with two options: create a Police Department or have no law enforcement coverage beyond emergency calls.

Town Administrator Cheryl Campbell is currently conducting interviews for the position of Police Chief. The Town should have two Police Officers and the Chief within a year.
